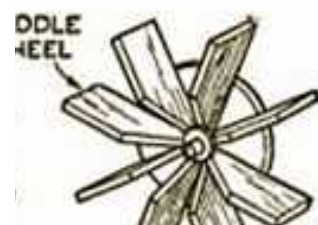

## Activity Sheet 5: Pleasure boats on the Severn Estuary

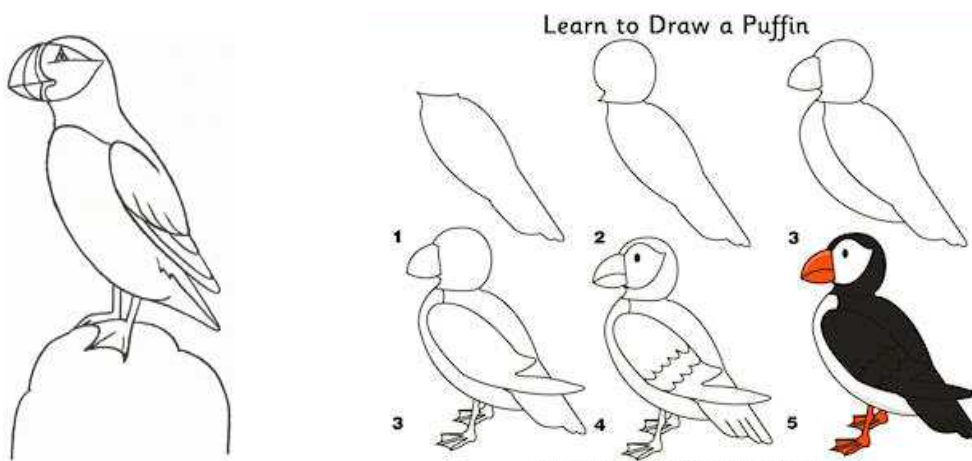


You can see the Waverley on Youtube, 'A Grand Day Out'

- **Research challenge:** Find out the history of the MV Balmoral or the Waverley: find out what the boat has done in its time; where it has travelled; the size of the boat; when and how it has been restored and how it is powered.

Puffins can be seen on Lundy island (Lundy means 'puffin island'). May is probably the best time to find them when they are nesting on the cliff tops. The puffin is a very unusual and colourful bird:

- Draw your own puffin and colour it in, with the right colours.



You can see how to draw a puffin on Youtube or look up Thomas Docherty; a children's book illustrator who shows 'How to draw a puffin and then look after it.'

- In 5-7 sentences, write or describe a puffin to a person who has never seen one before: its shape and colours on its beak

and body; the colour of its feet and legs; the shape and colour of its eyes and the colour of its wings and head.

- Find out more about the puffin: its lifestyle; where in the UK it is found (other than Lundy Island); what it eats; where it nests; how it moves; size and bird call/sound.

**Research challenge:** Advertise a journey by sea to Lundy Island on one of the passenger ships; the MV Balmoral or Waverley, telling passengers what is special about the boat itself, the journey and the island they are visiting.
